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The Muslim Leaves What Does Not Concern Him The First Sermon

All praise is due to Allah, the Lord of the worlds. I bear witness that there is no deity but Allah, the protector of the righteous, and I bear witness that our master and prophet Muhammad is His servant and trustworthy messenger. May Allah confer blessings, peace and benediction upon him, his family, companions, and all who follow them.

To proceed: I advise you, servants of Allah, and myself, to fear Allah. Allah, the Exalted, said: (يَا أَيُّهَا الَّذِينَ آمَنُوا اتَّقُوا اللهُ وَقُولُوا قَوْلًا سَدِيدًا)
"O you who have believed, fear Allah and speak righteous words." (Quran 33:70)

O believers, comprehensive prophetic words, containing beneficial insights, representing the pinnacle of morality and the completeness of faith, leading their enactor to the good pleasure of the Merciful. Indeed, these are the words of the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, who said:

«مِنْ حُسْنِ إِسْلَامِ الْمَرْءِ تَرْكُهُ مَا لَا يَعْنِيهِ»
"Among the good aspects of a person's Islam is leaving what does not concern him".

These eight words contain the most important elements that bring happiness to a person, to the extent that they have been described as one quarter of Islam. This is because a person's interference in matters that do not concern him is the root of mischief and malevolence. How many relationships has it ruined, how many problems has it created, how many rights and obligations has it neglected, and how many sins and transgressions has it caused.

The essence of what does not concern a person is anything he does not need regarding the necessities of his religion and worldly life, and which does not benefit him in pleasing his Lord, whether through deeds or words. Thus, a person's abandonment of what does not concern him, avoidance of what does not pertain to him, turning away from what does not interest him, and refraining from meddling in others' affairs are among the highest values that indicate the strength of his Iman (faith), the completeness of his Islam, the

purity of his heart, the balance of his soul, the refinement of his morals, the soundness of his intellect, and the fullness of his wisdom.

When Lugman the Wise was asked, "What is your wisdom?" he said:

"I do not ask about what I have been spared, and I do not concern myself with what does not concern me."

He was also asked, "How have you reached the state we see?" He replied:

"Truthfulness in speech, fulfilling trusts, and leaving what does not concern me".

The wise and rational person, **O** servants of Allah, engages in what benefits him and focuses on what is important to him, acting upon the saying of the

Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him: ﴿ اَكْرِصُ عَلَى مَا يَنْفَعُكَ ﴾ "Be eager for what benefits you."

He is assured that in leaving what does not concern him lies a path to what enriches him, so he does not entangle himself in the private and personal affairs of others, nor does he occupy himself with knowing the details of their situations. Rather, he is content with asking about their general well-being, enough to assure him about them.

As for going beyond that, such as asking about their homes, livelihoods, jobs, salaries, secrets, and personal matters, and from where they came or where they are going; this is a sign of lack of dignity and the ugliness of prying into others' affairs. People will turn away from such a person, and Allah will despise the one who engages in it. The Messenger of Allah, peace and blessings be

"Indeed, Allah has disliked for you three things: gossip, excessive questioning, and wasting wealth".

So beware, **O** servants of Allah, not to underestimate this trait, for its sin is great, its consequences severe, its outcome dire and its punishment painful. Anas ibn Malik, may Allah be pleased with him, said: "A man from the companions of the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, passed away,

and they said: Congratulations to you for Paradise. The Prophet, peace and

'And what do you know? Perhaps he spoke about what did not concern him.'

O servants of Allah: Whoever occupies himself with what does not concern him will certainly fall short in what does concern him. This is because such behavior squanders his time, wastes his life, scatters his focus, and hinders him from achieving his goals. It may also diminish his value and honour, weaken his status and position, erode his respect and esteem, and expose him to embarrassing situations. It has been said: "Whoever interferes in what does not concern him will hear what displeases him".

So leave what does not concern you, and you will attain the good pleasure of your Lord and the love of others.

(يَا أَيُّهَا الَّذِينَ آمَنُوا أَطِيعُوا اللَّهَ وَأَطِيعُوا الرَّسُولَ وَأُولِي (يَا أَيُّهَا الْآَدِينَ آمَنُولَ وَأُولِي اللَّهُ وَأَطِيعُوا الرَّسُولَ وَأُولِي

(O you who have believed, obey Allah and obey the Messenger and those in authority among you.)

I say this, and I seek forgiveness from Allah, my Lord.

The Second Sermon

Praise be to Allah, as is He rightly deserves, and peace and blessings be upon Muhammad, His Prophet and Servant, and upon his family and companions, and those who follow his guidance after him.

As for what follows: O servant of Allah, your beloved (Prophet), peace and blessings be upon him, has entrusted you with a piece of advice, so do not neglect it. He has given you a counsel, so do not ignore it, and he said:

«أُمْسِكُ عَلَيْكَ لِسَانَكَ» "Hold your tongue."

Do not speak except with what benefits you, and do not utter anything except what elevates you. Beware of delving into public matters that concern others or meddling in huge issues that are beyond understanding, for these are matters that have their own experts and authorities, and only their rightful custodians can address them appropriately. It is fitting for you, **O human**, to

restrain your tongue from them. "Speak good, and you will gain, or remain silent, and you will be safe." (وَلَا تَقْفُ مَا لَيْسَ لَكَ بِهِ عِلْمٌ

"And do not follow what you have no knowledge of."

«عَلَيْكَ بِخَاصَّةِ نَفْسِكَ»

"Your concern should be with your self,"

So engage with what nurtures and develops your self (soul) and take care of what corrects and mends your self. In that, there is fulfillment for you and sufficiency, away from pursuing news that reaches you or information disseminated through various communication channels and platforms, whether it is correct or flawed, truthful or false, and what has been added or subtracted from it; according to the interests and benefits sought by its promoters. Be perceptive and wise, do not let your tongue repeat everything you hear, and do not echo everything that is said. Teach your children and household not to delve into matters they do not understand or speak about everything they hear, for the Messenger of Allah, peace and blessings be upon

«كَفَى بِالْمَرْءِ إِثْمًا أَنْ يُحَدِّثَ بِكُلِّ مَا سَمِعَ» him, says:

"It is enough for a person as a sin that he talks about everything he hears." Direct them to thank Allah, the Exalted, for the blessing of safety and faith, and for the wise leadership that manages affairs with foresight and wisdom, and administers them with deliberation and thoughtfulness.

O Allah, send blessings, peace, and mercy upon our master Muhammad and upon his family and companions altogether. May Allah be pleased with Abu Bakr, Umar, Uthman, and Ali, and with all the noble companions. O Allah, make us faithful believers in You, devoted worshippers to You, repenting servants to You, and kind and dutiful children to our parents. Have mercy on them as they raised us when we were small, O Most Merciful of the merciful. Our Lord, whatever good we have asked of You, grant it to us, and whatever our prayers have fallen short of, bestow it upon us, for You are the Bestower. O Allah, Originator of the heavens and the earth, Owner of majesty and honor, and the might that cannot be contested, we ask You by the Light of Your Countenance to have mercy on us; by abandoning sins as long as You keep us alive, and by leaving what does not concern us, and to grant us sound judgment in what pleases You about us.

O Allah, bestow continuous and sustained stability onto our country, and confer complete health upon us, and expand our provisions, and bless us in

our spouses and offspring. O Allah, grant success to the President of the State, Sheikh Muhammad bin Zayed, and his deputies and brothers, the rulers of the Emirates, and his trustworthy Crown Prince, in what You love and are pleased with. O Allah, have mercy on Sheikh Zayed, and Sheikh Rashid, and the founding leaders, and admit them by Your grace into the vastness of Your gardens, and encompass the martyrs of the nation with Your mercy and forgiveness.

O Allah, have mercy on the Muslim men and Muslim women, the believing men and believing women, the living among them and the dead.

O Allah, give us rain and do not make us among the despairing. O Allah, relieve us, O Allah, relieve us.

"Our Lord, grant us good in this world and good in the Hereafter and save us from the torment of the Fire".

O servants of Allah: Remember Allah, the Mighty and Majestic, He will remember you, and be grateful to Him for His blessings, and He will increase you (in blessings). And establish the prayer.
